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- Yarn needle: A yarn needle will be used to weave in loose ends and secure the headband.

## -Scissors

- ch: chain
- sc: single crochet
- hdc: half double crochet
- dc: double crochet
- sl st: slip stitch

## Foundation Chain

1. Begin by creating a chain of 80 stitches. The length of the foundation chain will determine the width of the headband. Adjust as needed for a snug or looser fit.

## Row 1

1. Single crochet (sc) into the second chain from the hook and each chain across. Turn your work. (79 sc)

## Row 2

1. Chain 2 (counts as a hdc). Half double crochet (hdc) into the first stitch. Continue hdc in each stitch across. Turn your work. (79 hdc)

## Row 3

1. Chain 2 (counts as a dc). Double crochet (dc) into the first stitch. Continue dc in each stitch across. Turn your work. (79 dc)

## Rows 4-12

1. Repeat Row 3 for 9 more rows.

## Finishing

1. Slip stitch (sl st) into the first stitch of the last row. Cut the yarn, leaving a tail for weaving in.
2. Weave in loose ends using the yarn needle.
3. Fold the headband in half lengthwise and sew the ends together.
  - Add a touch of flair to your headband with embellishments such as buttons, beads, or lace. Sew them onto the headband for a personalized look.
  - Create a contrasting band by crocheting a few rows in a different color yarn. Attach it to the main band for a decorative touch.
  - Embroider a simple design or monogram onto the headband to make it even more unique.

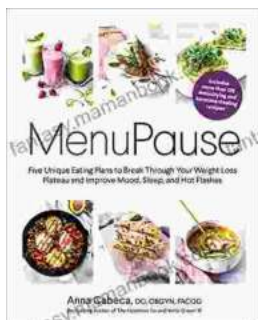


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
